This Addendum forms part of the project solicitation documents and will be incorporated into the Contract Documents, as applicable. Insofar as the Original Contract Documents, Drawings and Specifications are inconsistent, this Addendum shall govern. Please acknowledge receipt of this Addendum, at the time of bid submittal to Miami-Dade County, in the space provided on the "Acknowledgement of Addenda Form" provided with the project solicitation documents. Failure to acknowledge receipt of all addenda may be cause for disqualification.

#### STATEMENT RELEASED BY MIAMI-DADE COUNTY RELATED TO WAGE REQUIREMENTS:

On May 28, 2024, the Governor signed into law House Bill ("HB") 705. Prior to the adoption of HB 705, section 255.0992 of the Florida Statutes generally prohibited Miami-Dade County (the "County"), from requiring a contractor, subcontractor, or supplier to pay or provide a predetermined amount of wages or benefits to its employees or recruit or hire employees from a designated or restricted source in construction projects paid for with any state-appropriated funds. Additionally, under the same statute, the County could not apply small business measures or limit bidding among Small Business Enterprise-Construction ("SBE-Con") firms for construction projects paid for with any state funds. However, for contracts funded solely with County funds, prior to the adoption of HB 705, section 255.0992 did not limit the application of the County's SBE-Con program, responsible wages, or workforce requirements.

HB 705 revised the definition of the term "public works project" in Section 255.0992, Florida Statutes to include activities paid for with local County funds, making the various prohibitions found in section 255.0992 applicable to County funded construction contracts. HB 705 impacts construction projects that are in various phases of the procurement process whether pending advertisement or bid submittal, and in some cases pending contract award with bids having been received. Thus, considering the passing of HB 705, effective July 1, 2024, the following prohibitions exist:

- <u>The County's Responsible Wages & Benefits, Community Workforce, Residence First Training and Employment, and Employ Miami-Dade Program requirements</u> <u>will not</u> be applied to the County's capital construction projects, including design-build projects, awarded after July 1, 2024.
- <u>The County's SBE-Con requirements</u> <u>cannot be applied</u> on any capital construction projects, including design-build projects, if initial bids or proposals are received on or after July 1, 2024.

### 1. CHANGES TO VOLUME I:

A. In light of the passing of House Bill HB 705 effective July 1, 2024, the following articles will no longer apply to the Solicitation Documents:

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- a. Capital Volume I, Advertisement for Bids, the County's Responsible Wages & Benefits, Community Workforce, Residence First Training and Employment, and Employ Miami-Dade Program requirements will not be applied, and Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Construction percentage has changed from 1.28% to 0.00% for this contract; thus, there are no SBE Con Measures for this contract.
- b. Capital Volume I, Section 2 Solicitation Forms, Fair Wage Affidavit is, is no longer a requisite for this contract.
- c. Capital Volume I, Section 2 Solicitation Forms, Certificate of Assurance, is no longer a requisite for this contract.
- d. Capital Volume I, Section 2 Solicitation Forms, Responsible Contractor/Subcontractor Affidavit Form (RFTE 1), is no longer a requisite for this contract.
- e. Capital Volume I, Section 3 Instruction to Bidders, Article 4 Small Business Enterprise Construction Program (SBE-CONST & SBE-GS), is no longer a requisite for this contract.
- f. Capital Volume I, Section 5 Supplementary Conditions, Article 1.04 Applicable Wage Rates), is no longer applicable for this contract.
- g. Capital Volume I, Section 5 Supplementary Conditions, Article 1.07 Additional SBE-CONST Contract Measure Requirements, is no longer a requisite for this contract.
- h. Capital Volume I, Section 5 Supplementary Conditions, Article 1.08 Community Workforce Program), is no longer applicable for this contract.
- i. Capital Volume I, Section 5 Supplementary Conditions, Article 1.10 Residents First Training and Employment Program Compliance, is no longer a requisite for this contract.
- j. Capital Volume I, Section 5 Supplementary Conditions, Article 1.1 Employee Miami-Dade Program, is no longer a requisite for this contract.
- k. Capital Volume I, Section 5 Supplementary Conditions:
  - Appendix A: Miami-Dade County Wages and Benefits, are no longer applicable for this contract.
  - Appendix B: Small Business Division, Project Worksheet is no longer a requisite for this contract.
  - Appendix D: Responsible Contractor Affidavit Forms (RTFE 1, RTFE 2, RTFE 3, and RTFE 4) are no longer a requisite for this contract.
